Each year, UTS formally recognises and celebrates the outstanding achievements of our alumni community, including graduates from our six antecedent institutions.

The UTS Alumni Awards highlight the breadth and depth of UTS's alumni community and the extraordinary ways in which UTS graduates are contributing to their profession and society as a whole.

Nominations for the 2019 UTS Alumni Awards open **9am Wednesday 6 February** and close **midnight Friday 22 March 2019**.

We seek nominations for alumni who have:

- Achieved success in professional, academic or research areas.
- Demonstrated exceptional leadership, innovation and creativity, and
- Contributed to the community through their work.

Award Categories

Faculty Awards

These recognise outstanding achievement by graduates from the following seven UTS faculties:

- Arts and Social Sciences
- Business
- Design, Architecture and Building
- Engineering and Information Technology
- Health
- law
- Science

Nominations should articulate the success and impact nominees have had in their chosen field. Alumni do not have to be working in the discipline from which they graduated.

Special Awards

Community Alumni Award

This award recognises the significant involvement of UTS alumni in projects that enrich the community at a local, national or international level. This contribution could be in a professional, charitable, cultural or sporting capacity.

Indigenous Alumni Award

This award celebrates the exceptional professional achievement and/or significant contribution to Indigenous people and/or Australian society more broadly, by a UTS alumnus who is an Aboriginal person or Torres Strait Islander.

International Alumni Award

sponsored by UTS Insearch

This award recognises outstanding achievement by an alumnus enrolled as an international student when attending UTS. Candidates may currently reside in Australia or overseas.

Young Alumni Award

This award recognises outstanding achievement by an alumnus aged 35 years and younger (at close of nominations), and celebrates the accomplishments of emerging UTS alumni.

Chancellor's Award for Excellence

This award is presented by the UTS Chancellor to one of the faculty or special category award recipients. The award recognises a graduate with a sustained record of outstanding achievement who is seen as a leader of their field. The recipient of this award is welcomed to the UTS Luminaries, a group who have a reputation that is widespread and acknowledged – their achievements have earned them national or international prominence. Members of this group include actor Hugh Jackman, author Anna Funder, and human rights activist Dr Sekai Holland.

Eligibility and Selection

All nominations must be submitted online via the official UTS Alumni Awards portal by **midnight on Friday 22 March 2019**.

Go to <u>alumni.uts.edu.au/nominate</u> and follow the prompts to the nominations portal.

Eligibility

Award recipients must be graduates of UTS or one of our six antecedent institutions:

- · Acupuncture Colleges Australia
- Balmain Teachers' College
- Kuring-gai College of Advanced Education
- New South Wales Institute of Technology
- Sydney College of Advanced Education
- The School of Design, Sydney College of the Arts

A graduate can be nominated for more than one award.

Self-nominations are not accepted.

UTS Luminaries and past UTS Alumni Award recipients are not eligible.

Previously nominated alumni who were unsuccessful can be re-nominated.

Selection Process

 For Faculty Awards, the Dean of that Faculty will shortlist five nominees to present to the Selection Panel for consideration.

- Representatives from UTS International and UTS Insearch along with the Pro-Vice-Chancellor (Indigenous Leadership and Engagement) will shortlist five nominees for the International Alumni and Indigenous Australian Alumni award categories to present to the Selection Panel for consideration.
- The Selection Panel will review and select nominees for the Community Alumni and Young Alumni award categories.
- The Chancellor's Award for Excellence recipient will be personally selected by the UTS Chancellor.

Selection Panel

The Selection Panel will look for individuals who have:

- Achieved success in professional, academic or research areas (provide evidence of outstanding achievement)
- Demonstrated exceptional leadership, innovation and creativity (supply evidence of impact)
- Contributed to the community through their work and life (provide evidence to show involvement in civic, cultural, sporting, charitable or volunteer activities)

The panel reserves the right to reallocate nominations between categories.





Steps to nominate

- Nominations should be prepared with attention to detail, ensuring that all relevant information is included.
- The nomination form will require responses to the following four questions:
 - Please describe why you think the nominee should be considered for this award (250 words)
 - Please describe the nominee's achievements and impact related to their industry, profession or community (500 words)
 - If the nominee would be suitable for additional categories (i.e. other faculties or one of the special awards – Community, Young, Indigenous Australian or International), please explain why (250 words)
 - 4. Please provide any final additional comments to support this nomination (250 words)
- When answering these questions, nominators should include information and examples as to why the nominee is exceptional.
- When outlining the involvement of a nominee in a particular project, nominators should describe the impact of the nominee and make sure to include as many relevant details as possible to demonstrate excellence.

All nominations will need to:

- Be completed and submitted online via the official nomination website. Go to <u>alumni.uts.edu.au/nominate</u> and follow the prompts to the nominations portal.
- Be submitted by midnight Friday 22 March 2019.

If a nominee is **shortlisted**, the nominator must seek permission from the alumnus and request a current CV no longer than five pages.

Please note:

- An alumnus can be nominated for more than one award.
- UTS reserves the right to use award recipients' names and images in the media and UTS publications in the context of the UTS Alumni Awards.
- The Selection Panel reserves the right to reallocate nominations between categories.
- The decisions of the Selection Panel and Chancellor are final and conclusive, and there will be no correspondence regarding the decisions.
- A nomination will be valid for two years following submission.
- Previous award winners are eligible for renomination after a five year period.
